## **NEED ASSISTANCE OR A RIDE? HAVE QUESTIONS?**

WHO ARE WE VOTING FOR? Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Representative in congress, State Senator and Representative and ballot questions.

**HAVE YOU MOVED?** Vote where you are registered. You can vote at your old polling place one more time if you have moved.

**NEED ID?** You do not need ID unless it is your first time voting at a new polling site, otherwise, you DO NOT need ID to vote. Acceptable forms of ID include a valid PA driver's/non-driver's license, a voter registration card, valid passport, federal government ID card, valid student ID, firearm permit, a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, or government check.

**NAME NOT ON THE LIST?** Ask a poll worker to call the Board of Elections to find out where you should vote or call Vote for Homes, 215-232-7272.

**PROVISIONAL BALLOT:** If you are told you may not vote for any reason you may request a *Provisional Ballot* (paper ballot). Ask for a receipt.

WHO CAN VOTE IN PA? Citizens over the age of 18 and who registered before October 6, 2014. You can vote if you are on probation or on parole, serving time for a misdemeanor, in jail awaiting trial, on house arrest, have a previous felony, or are not on pre-release status.

**NEED HELP VOTING?** Voters may choose someone to assist them. Anyone can help them *except* the voter's union representative, employer, or the Judge of Elections. A *Vote for Homes!* volunteer may assist you if you wish.

CHALLENGES: If pollwatchers challenge your right to vote – ask for an affidavit and have another voter in your division verify your identity.
