## WHERE DO I VOTE?

Confirm Polling Site Before You Vote

- ELECTION PROTECTION HOTLINE: 1-866-OUR-VOTE (1-866-687-8683) You can also call this number if you have any problems voting.
- **ONLINE:** <u>vote.pa.gov/status</u> to find out where you are registered.

### MAIL-IN BALLOT INFORMATION

- **Mail Option:** Applications for mail-in ballots must be received by the county election office by 5pm on May 9. Mail-in ballots must be **received** by 8pm on May 16.
- **Deliver by 8pm on Election Day:** In Philadelphia, you can bring your mail-in ballot to City Hall or 520 N. Columbus Blvd.
- Check ballot status: <a href="mailto:vote.pa.gov/MailBallotStatus">vote.pa.gov/MailBallotStatus</a>
- If you cannot hand deliver your ballot to the Board of Elections or another location: You can still go to your polling location. Bring your ballot and voter declaration envelope to your polling location, sign that you have not already voted, and vote in person.
- What if your mail-in ballot did not come in time? Anyone who requested a mail-in ballot can vote in person on a provisional (paper) ballot. You won't be allowed to vote on the city's voting machines, but you can vote by paper ballot and it will be counted later.

#### **NEED VOTER ID?**

Voters only need ID if it is their first time voting at a new polling site.

### WHO IS ON THE BALLOT?

You'll be deciding on candidates running for Philadelphia Mayor, Register of Wills, Sheriff, City Council, City Commissioners, Court of Common Pleas, and Municipal Courts as well as voting on ballot questions.

#### WHO CAN VOTE?

- All Pennsylvanians who are registered by Monday May 1, 2023.
- Persons with felony convictions ARE allowed to vote after their release. (This includes those on probation, parole, and house arrest.)
